Do we like more stamps being issued by Canada? Sure we do! Every new issue is a part of the Elizabethan era — right up our alley. Here is what Canada Post is up to these days...

™Postal Rates To Rise

Canada Post has proposed postal rate increases for January 17, 2005:

Domestic Lettermail: to 50ϕ (from current 49ϕ)

USA: to 85ϕ (from current 80ϕ)

International: to \$1.45 (from current \$1.40)

Notice what the rates were some ten years ago! Quite an increase in the foreign destinations.

Although the post office will tell you that rates are not increasing very much — at least for domestic service (on average it is only ½¢ per year) — they certainly are rising dramatically for foreign service.

TM Local" Issues

Canada Post has announced that there will be *no more* 'local' issues of Canadian stamps. Although they have never used the term 'local', many issues this year were distributed in a localized manner.

™2005 Stamp Program

The 2005 Canada Stamp Program is expected to be announced any day now. In fact, I suspect it will be announced the day this is mailed (according to "Murphy's Law"!). *

Tinancial Statements

Our new treasurer, Ron Rush, has put together a financial statements that show the health of our study group as it appeared when he took over this role. This is based on statements and records that he recently received from our previous treasurer, Eppe Bosch. Please note that all amounts in this statement are in US dollars. The next statement, to be finalized after our current year end (June 30, 2005), will reflect Canadian dollars as that is where our accounts now reside.

™Colour Printing

How important is the availability of colour illustrations to you in the *Corgi Times*? The cost of colour laser printers have dropped significantly. Should the Elizabethan Study Group II purchase a colour laser printer and print the *Corgi Times* on this printer, instead of having it photocopied in black and white at Office Depot?

As an example, the Samsung CLP (Colour Laser Printer) is available for 'only' C\$700. Toner is about \$180 per cartridge (black, cyan, magenta, yellow sold separately). With a rating of 5,000 pages per cartridge at 5% coverage, that comes out to about 14ϕ per page. Our current costs are $7\frac{1}{2}\phi$ per page for black and white.

If there is a member of our group who has experience with the new inexpensive colour laser printers we would love to hear from you. How is the quality? Could we print 125 copies of our bi-monthly journal (at 16 pages per issue) and reproduce the images in colour at a relatively inexpensive on-going cost?

White Queen Award

Purpose:


To recognize and encourage exhibitors who have worked hard for excellence of presentation of Canadian Elizabethan II material.

Criteria:

The ESG "White Queen" may be awarded at any local, regional or national show provided:

- the show has 200 pages (8 1/2" x 11" or equivalent) of exhibited material. [shows with over 500 pages of competitive material may have two "White Queen" awards]
- there are a minimum of two Canadian Elizabethan II exhibits¹ in competition
- in the event of only one Canadian Elizabethan II exhibit the White Queen may be awarded provided the exhibit received a Silver award and in the opinion of the jury otherwise meets the criteria
- Canadian Elizabethan-era literature is also eligible, provided there are a minimum of two Elizabethan II-era literature entries in a recognized literature competition (if only title is entered, then it must have been awarded at least a Silver award)

White Queen Award Pin



- **Layout** the balanced and eye appealing arrangement of exhibit pages; highlighting of an exhibit's material.
- **Title page** provides the viewer with a logical roadmap to follow in viewing the exhibit. It is written in concise, yet descriptive terms.
- **Logic of presentation**—the flow of pages in telling the material's story is logical. The material is pertinent to and within the parameters set down by the title.
- Write-up is pertinent, brief, non-redundant and provides meaningful information.
- Neatness the pages are clean. The write-up method is neat and tidy. The mounts are subtle and even.

The judges decision is final.

The award winner will receive the "White Queen" pin (illustrated above) at the time of exhibiting. Upon receipt of the show's final Award Report, the ESG will mail a year's subscription of *The Corgi Times*, the award-winning newsletter of the Elizabethan II Study Group, to *first time* "White Queen" award winner/s (that is, a multiple-time award winner may receive more than one pin but will only ever be eligible to receive *one* one-year's free subscription). It is crucial that the exhibitor's complete address be provided on the Award Report form.

Three Major Errors in the Current Definitive Series Have Been Found!

Introduction

Collectors have changed the famous adage 'To Err is Human To Forgive is Divine' to 'To Err is Human To Find is Divine'. This is not surprising, as there is nothing that generates so much excitement among philatelists as the discovery of a major error. The current series like many of the earlier definitive series is not free of major errors. Until June 2004, three major errors were discovered: a fully imperforate error; a partially imperforate error; and missing design error. This brief article will elaborate on these different major errors.

Major Errors in the Current Definitive Series

Fully Imperforate error: The fully imperforate error was the 10-cent artistic woodwork stamp. This error was found by David Stein in Montreal on July 18, 2003. The top row of the sheet of stamps was not perforated creating fully imperforate errors as a result of an improperly misperforated sheet. David Stein states "These stamps were printed at the Canadian Bank Note Company (Canada Post told the National Post newspaper that they came from Ashton-Potter - but I determined otherwise). The error was probably created when a single print sheet of stamps was removed for inspection during the print run. The sheet that contained four to six panes of 100 stamps was not properly replaced and passed through the perforating machine. Quality control did not pick up the error and at least two panes made it to the post office."[1] If David Stein's observations are correct then this major error came from the second printing of Canadian Bank Note Company. David Stein obtained the ten imperforates from the pane in pairs as the sheet was torn into vertical blocks of ten. An illustration of this fully imperforate error together with the misperforated stamps is shown hereafter.

Partially Imperforate error: The partially imperforate error was the \$8 grizzly bear. This error was reported in the catalogue of Eastern Auctions Ltd., June 26, 2004. The catalogue on page 103 states "\$8.00 Grizzly Bear Mint pane of four stamps, imperforate horizontally at top and partially at top of the vertical rows. A rare and eye-appealing variety."[2] The pane of four is missing the perforation from the center of the stamps vertically together with the horizontal perforation at the top. This can be seen in the illustration shown hereafter.

The pattern of perforation created in this error is that of a Harrow perforator used by CBN. A 1-row Harrow perforator perforates half of the vertical perforation of stamps in two rows of stamps together with one row of horizontal perforation of stamps with each strike. A 2-row perforator would perforate twice this amount with each strike. This would mean one complete row of stamps would be perforated vertically and half of the rows at the top and at the bottom of the complete row together with the two rows of horizontal perforations. From the above pattern one cannot tell whether the stamps were perforated with a 1-row or 2-row perforator. It appears that the perforator missed the top strike of the pane which resulted in the partially imperforate error.

Missing Design error: The missing design error was found on the \$5 Moose stamp with the moose and vegetation missing. On the first day of summer 2004, Ian Kimmerly announced the discovery of this error.[3] It is not known who found this error, Kimmerly reports that it came into the store on a consignment basis and in less than 48 hours it was sold. The printing of this stamp involved two distinct printing processes which suggests the cause of the missing design. First, the lithographic process prints most of the inscription on the stamp on gummed paper. Second, the steel engraving process prints the design which includes the moose and vegetation. If one process is missed, the result is stamps without a part of the design. Ian Kimmerly described the cause as follows: "During the intaglio printing process two sheets became temporarily "stuck" together with the result that the top sheet was printed normally and the bottom sheet received a faint impression, but no ink. The two sheets then went through the perforating and guillotining process and it is obvious why this dramatic error was not caught by postal inspectors." [3]

How many such errors are likely to exist depends on the printing format. It has been suggested that 6 mini-panes of four stamps were printed per sheet. Out of the 6, at least 5 of the panes were discovered. One was returned to the Post Office: 3 are in the hands of one dealer and 1 was sold by Ian Kimmerly. It is believed that the sixth pane is likely to be in private hands.

Concluding Remarks

To sum up, not many of these major errors are expected to exist. This is evident from the high prices that they have been offered for sale at auctions or at the retail stores. So if any philatelist has been lucky enough to own one of these errors it is as good as money in the bank. A few of these errors may still be in philatelic stocks of the Post Office, so keep looking!

ORAPEX/BNAPEX Overprints

Write Me...Ring Me Greeting Stamps

Canada Post issued some unique stamps in a unique format on May 31st of this year.

Four new non-denominated domestic-rate *Greeting* stamps were issued that include the design printed directly onto the stamp. This is a departure from all previous Greeting stamps where a design was printed on a separate label that could be placed into the centre of the postage stamp.



Write Me...Ring Me Greeting's Stamps — 4 singles (presented in the order of the UPC barcode found on the greeting card) Designs: Butterfly, Beach, Rose, Dog

The stamps, printed by Ashton-Potter, are sold in four separate standard size greeting cards, each of which contains two stamps, attached to the left inside panel of the card. A matching phone card of 15 minutes (the *ring* me part of the promotion) is inserted into the right side of the greeting card.

The greeting cards, containing two stamps and the phone card, sell for \$5.99 each. So, that will run you about \$24 to purchase 8 stamps.


1971 Christmas

5¢ Wilding Perforation Shift

John has passed along the following couple of perforation errors on the 5ϕ Wilding definitive. Based on other examples of the 5ϕ Wilding definitive that show similar characteristics, these two blocks and strip of 20 all come from the same printing sheet of 400 stamps (plate 11). The strip of 20 comes from the upper left pane of 100 stamps; the other two blocks come from the lower right pane of 100.

Two other examples are illustrated in the 1952–53~Karsh, 1954–62~Wilding, 1962–66~Cameo~Definitives book by Robin Harris (see figure 400 on page 104 and figure 412 on page 106). An article illustrating a mock-up of the full misperforated sheet of 400 stamps was presented in the Nov-Dec 1999 Corgi~Times (page 46–48).
