# 2015 Stamp Program Announced

The July–August 2014 *Details* magazine included a 'brief' listing of Canada Post's 2015 stamp program. Here is a scan of that announcement:

Among definitives, our Canadian flag stands proudly on domestic Permanent<sup>TM</sup> stamps depicting UNESCO World Heritage sites of Old Town Lunenburg (N.S.), SGang Gwaay (B.C.), the Rideau Canal (Ont.), the Landscape of Grand Pré (N.S.), and Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump (Alta.). These sites first appeared on our 2014 U.S. and international commemoratives. We also introduce a new multi-year series, Provincial Birds.

As for commemoratives, in January, the seventh issue of the Lunar New Year series features the Year of the Ram. We also celebrate Sir John A. Macdonald's 200<sup>th</sup> birthday. February ushers in stamps on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Canadian flag and later on, Responsible Pet Ownership.

Spring blooms in March with pansies for our annual flower issue. In April, you can see what's

developed in our third edition of Canadian Photography. May brings us the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of John McCrae's *In Flanders Fields*, more UNESCO World Heritage sites and a look (way) back at Canadian dinosaurs and other prehistoric creatures. We kick off June with the FIFA Women's World Cup<sup>TM</sup> issue and launch a series on a subject always on our minds – Canadian Weather Extremes.

In September, we issue a new fundraising stamp for the Canada Post Community Foundation and cast a spooky return of Haunted Canada. The year concludes with a third line-up of NHL® heroes and our annual tribute to the holidays, when we unveil a new sacred stamp of the Madonna and Child and a series celebrating how we deck our halls.

#### Canada Post News

Here is what Canada Post is up to these days...

#### **▶** 150th Anniversaries of Charlottetown and Quebec Conferences

Well, Canada Post elected *not* to honour the historic 150th anniversaries of the Charlottetown Conference and Quebec Conference with postage stamps, as they had honoured with stamps on the 100th anniversary back in 1964.

Instead, commemorative envelopes, with a quantity of likely only 8,000 each, were issued on September 1 and October 10, respectively. Too bad that the two most important historical events with a significant anniversary in 2014 were beat out by several living Canadians (Country artists, comedians, and NHL players), some of whose accomplishments have yet to stand the test of time.



#### **▶** 2014/04 Quarterly Pack

The fourth quarterly pack of 2014 was made available in mid-November, even though it is advertised as having the stamps issued from October through December (as of this writing there have been no stamps issued in December). This year's quarter three pack is priced at \$33.75.

Be aware that this pack does *not* contain the NHL \$2.50 souvenir sheets (6 panes). You will need to purchase the those separate from the quarterly pack.

#### ▶ Stuck on Stamps 2014 # 4

The fourth *Stuck on Stamps* package for 2014, advertised as "For Kids", also became available in mid November. These packages contain mint copies of newly released stamps along with 'collecting' cards containing information about each included stamp.

This is the tenth such *Stuck on Stamps* pack that Canada Post has released (they started in 2012).

## **Thanks Canada Post!**



Having bought too many of the \$2.50 NHL souvenir sheets in the hopes of finding one of the '1-in-50-packs' autographed card, I have begun making excuses to use the stamps on outgoing mail.

One of my recent mailings only required \$1.80 in postage, but since it was going to a collector friend who would appreciate a nice, sock-on-the-nose cancellation, I 'splurged' and used the Harry Howell souvenir sheet stamp. I had it hand cancelled at my local post office in Beausejour, MB.

Somewhere on its trip to Alberta, it received a couple of nice thick black marker "hand cancels". Someone at Canada Post either had too much time on their hands or wasn't a Harry Howell fan!

Much of the mail I have received in recent *years* that has had commemorative stamps used as postage have not been cancelled. It seems that Canada Post's sorting/cancelling machines can only recognize about 100 recent stamp images (most likely just the current definitives and a few commemoratives). Too bad *those* didn't get the 'black marker treatment', leaving the already-cancelled \$2.50 NHL souvenir sheet alone.



I'm sure we all have similar stories of either sending or receiving an item that has had a similar "personalized" cancellation experience from a conscientious Canada Post employee. *Canadian Stamp News* shows examples from time to time. If my failing memory serves me well, I think this is my first which makes it 'unique'. Perhaps someone on e-Bay will appreciate it?



Are you hoping for a special stamp-related item under the Christmas tree this year?

I'd like to see a Scott 503a, the 6¢ 1969 Christmas stamp with the black omitted. I'm preparing an exhibit on this issue and this particular variety would give the exhibit a bit of 'star power'. I guess I better write Santa a letter!



# Wait for Me Daddy

The *Wait for Me Daddy* stamp issue of October 4 included a self-adhesive stamp issued in booklets of 10, and a water-activated gum stamp issued in a "special pane of 5 stamps" (as described by Canada Post in the October 2014 *Details* magazine).

Over the past several years, the issuing of a souvenir sheet along with a multi-stamp issue has become commonplace as it is far easier for Canada Post to include the souvenir sheet in the annual collection of stamps than it is to include several individual stamps. However, in this case, the "special pane of 5 stamps" will certainly *not* be included in the annual collection.

Why then was a pane of 5, shrink-wrapped no less for distribution and sales at post offices, included as part of this stamp release? My guess (purely speculative on my part) is that "the most famous Canadian photograph of the Second World War and one of the most recognized of all war photos" required some special attention. Providing a much larger image in the selvedge of a large 'pane' would be one way to highlight the photograph. What about the pane of 5 stamps? As we have reported in a previous Corgi Times, ever since the postal rates rose to 85¢ on March 31, 2014, Canada Post will no longer sell a single stamp for 85¢. If you wish to mail a single letter and need to buy a stamp at a postal outlet, you must purchase a \$1 stamp. I suspect that someone at Canada Post has determined that a 'pane of five 85¢ stamps' is the minimum quantity that should be sold (i.e. it would not work to sell a pane containing just one stamp). As a result, this is the second water-activated gum pane that has been sold in a shrink-wrapped package (the other being the RMS *Empress of Ireland* stamp issue of May 29, 2014).



For the numismatists in our group, the Royal Canadian Mint issued a \$2 circulation coin and two collector coins featuring the *Wait for Me Daddy* photograph.







#### Constant variety?

As an aside, please check your 'pane of 5 stamps' and see if you have this 'white spot', found on the middle stamp of the pane. I have spoken with a couple of other collectors; one has the same variety while the other does not. I have checked a couple of post offices without any further findings. If the variety is constant, it is not found on all panes. Reports of your findings would be most welcome.





# The End of Slogan Inkjet Cancels (2010-2014)?

Bob Thorne (a non-ESG member), collects machine cancellations of Canada. He is considered a leading expert in this field.

Two-line slogan inkjet cancellations were first seen on April 29, 2010 from Winnipeg, MB. The cancels are produced on the high-speed OCR Toshiba TT1200 machines. These machines are now in use at 15 locations across Canada. A machine is in use at Gateway in Mississauga (L4W) for sorting purposes only (i.e. there are no cancellations).



The 4-digit machine number is based on the VES barcoding found on the reverse of covers. These have been in use since 1991 (first seen in Stoney Creek, ON). The machine numbers began to appear in the cancellations on June 22, 2012.

Starting in June 2014, the slogan portion of the inkjet cancellation began to disappear. The tables below list, by location, the known cancellation machines along with their earliest known date of use ("Early"), the last known date of use of the 2-line slogan cancellation ("2014 slogan") and the earliest known use of the 2-line *non*-slogan (i.e. short) cancellation ("2014 no slogan").

The postal code of a newly installed machine into a plant defaults to "K1A" until it has been programmed and configured. There are instances where a location has cancelled mail with this postal code by mistake:


